Maryland Legal Aid Partners with Loyola University to Host Expungement Clinic

BALTIMORE, MARYLAND, (February 10, 2023) – Maryland Legal Aid (MLA) is partnering with Loyola University to host an Expungement Clinic on Sunday, March 26, 2023. Individuals with a criminal history will have an opportunity to be advised by legal professionals and have petitions prepared on site. This one-on-one expungement assistance can be life-changing for the vast number of people who qualify.

This event will mark the third expungement clinic Loyola University Maryland and Maryland Legal Aid have partnered to host. Nearly a hundred clients were aided in the past two events and 135 petitions were issued.

Clinic volunteers will help participants on a first-come, first-served basis. No appointment needed.
